ARE CORPORATE HUMAN RIGHTS OFFENDERS RECRUITING ON YOUR COLLEGE CAMPUS?

As the Fall semester of classes begins, so does another year of worrying about what you are going to do with yourself when you finish college. Lucky for you, your school's career center has set up several career fairs and recruitment events to guide you in the right direction. It's likely that a representative from at least one of the companies SHAREPOWER is focusing on this year—Dow, Chevron, and Yahoo—will be on your campus at some point, presenting an excellent opportunity to raise awareness about these companies' human rights abuses and gain new members for your campus AI group or SHAREPOWER campaign.

An action at a career fair can be anything from handing out flyers at the event to signing up for an interview with one of these companies and then asking the recruiter the tough questions about the company's business practices and human rights behavior. A simple press release or editorial in your school's newspaper before or after the event can lay out the issues and create discussion among members of your student body. And of course, anything that disrupts the recruitment process will be reported back to the CEOs, especially if you go to a large university or one that has a strong engineering, chemistry, or business program.
