Human Rights Defender Shackelia Jackson's brother Nakiea was killed by police in Jamaica. There has been no accountability for his death. That's true of countless other killings by police in the country—and in the United States as well. The Guardian estimates that 1,093 people were killed by police in the US last year, disproportionately affecting people of color. Furthermore, an Amnesty International USA report found that every US state falls short of restricting the use of deadly force by police in line with human rights standards. This crisis of killing must stop. Hear firsthand from Shackelia about her brother's story and what you can do to help stop these killings.
