Ahmed Amari, his wife Amina, and their four young children Amir, Raja, Mariyan, and Hana fled from the war in Syria. After waiting two years, they were accepted for U.S. resettlement. They were ready to travel when the first Muslim ban went into effect and stranded them in Lebanon.

AIUSA sent a letter to the Department of Homeland Security and launched an accompanying petition action urging it expedite the review of the Amari family's case. The family finally resettled to their new home in Charlottesville, Virginia in late summer 2019.
