Sadat fled from homophobic attacks in Ghana and requested asylum in the U.S. He was held for over two-and-a-half years in immigration detention in Pearson, Texas, where he conducted hunger strikes in protest of the poor conditions he endured.

Amnesty and other organization mobilized in his support, sending tens of thousands of actions to U.S. immigration authorities. A few weeks later, he was released on parole and freed!

We continued to support his case as he waited adjudication of his claim, and a year later, Sadat won his asylum case in the U.S. in October 2019.
