OUR BODIES, OUR STORIES

In this interactive lesson, students have the opportunity to read abortion stories and engage in conversation around access, reproductive rights, and the humanization of the individuals behind these stories.

HOW TO RUN THIS LESSON:

- Print out **ABORTION STORIES** and tape them around the classroom/space.
- Allow students to go on a gallery walk around the classroom/space and read each abortion story.
- Stop students at each abortion story and have them engage in conversation with their peers using the following guiding questions:
 - What feelings, sensations, lived experiences, thoughts, etc. come up for you as you read this abortion story?
 - Why is storytelling a powerful tool to use when defending access to abortion?
 - What role does intersectionality play when it comes to accessing abortion?
 - Why is abortion access a human right?
- Bring students back together as a whole community and encourage them to share what they discussed in small groups, what they learned, and/or what they are taking away from this activity.
