URGENT ACTION

FREE ENVIRONMENTAL DEFENDER

Vidal Brítez was <u>detained</u> on March 26 in Paso Yobái, Guairá because he was expressing his right to defend a clean, healthy, and <u>sustainable</u> environment. The <u>Prosecutor's Office</u> has stated that Vidal participated in an incident which he did not take part in. We are urging the Prosecutor's Office to respect Mr Brítez's right to freedom of expression, including the right to protest, and to drop the charges so that he can be released.

Dear Dr. Rolón,

I am writing to you because I am very worried about Vidal Britez. He is a respected leader in Paraguay who helps to protect the right to food and to a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment. He plays a **critical** role in defending against **pollution** in Paso Yobái.

Amnesty International is concerned that he was arrested because of his **activism** for the environment. His family is also very worried about his health because he suffers from a severe asthma condition.

According to the international law on human rights, governments are obligated to protect and respect human rights as well the right to defend human rights. Arresting and charging Mr. Britez for his activism breaks international human rights law and discourages other human rights defenders from advocating for a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment. Paraguay also has an obligation to ensure that Vidal has a fair trial.

I urge you to drop the charges against Mr. Britez and respect the right to defend human rights in Paraguay.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION







Vidal Brítez (pictured in photo speaking at a community gathering) is 56 years old and grows yerba mate, a traditional South American tea made from leaves and stems. Mr. Brítez is a community leader and president of the Santa Maria's Association of Yerba Mate Producers in Paso Yobái. He works hard to defend the right to food and protests against the pollution that is caused by gold mining exploitation in the area.

The companies that mine for gold use harmful chemicals like **mercury** and **cyanide** which are very harmful to the

environment. The pollution has made it difficult to grow yerba mate, a national symbol in Paraguay. Yerba mate growers have filed formal complaints against the **environmental crimes** that continue to take place but **illegal** polluting practices continue.

On January 10, 2025, there was an altercation between a local resident of Paso Yobái who mines gold and a neighbor who grows yerba mate. With the help of a court order and the National Police, the gold miner brought trucks filled with mining waste onto the yerba grower's property which resulted in stones being thrown with slingshots. Due to this incident, the police opened a criminal case against 6 members of the Yerba Producers Association, including Mr. Brítez, who was not present at the time of this incident. He was at home during this time about 3 miles away.

Mr. Brítez's family is concerned about his asthma condition and believe that his arrest and the stress caused by this arrest could make him very sick.
